### PRESS RELEASE

On 02-17-10 at approximately 8:00 a.m., Nampa Police Patrol Officers and Detectives responded to a report of a residential burglary, which had just occurred in the 2100 block of 1<sup>st</sup> St So in Nampa Idaho. It was reported that the suspect, later identified as 19-year-old Shane M. Dunn, had entered the residence while a female occupant was still at the residence sleeping. The resident was awakened to find Dunn still in the residence committing the theft. The suspect left the residence and the female was not harmed.

Dunn was picked up in the area of the burglary a short time later and subsequently arrested and charged with Burglary, which holds the penalty of a Felony in the state of Idaho and was later charged with Obstruct and Resist by falsely implicating another in the commission of a crime, which holds the penalty of a Misdemeanor.

The Nampa Police Department would like to thank all of the Nampa citizens for their cooperation in this investigation.

#### Tips for home safety:

1. Check all doors and windows to make sure they are completely secure during the nighttime hours and the hours in which the residence is not occupied. (Criminals do not like to work at committing a crime very hard.)
2. Turn porch lights on during nighttime or low light hours for better visibility. (Criminals do not appreciate anyone being able to see them while attempting to break in to a residence.)
3. Keep a light and radio on in the residence. (Noise and light in the residence is a good sign someone is at home and the residence is less likely to be entered.)
4. Trim bushes and hedges back away from windows, to eliminate hiding places around the residence.
5. Close Garage doors when not in the garage. (They make perfect access into a residence when left open.)
